At this time each year, I always like to reflect on what has transpired during the school year. One of the STA goals was to increase member involvement. In order to reach that goal, an STA Facebook page was created, member events were held in each building, members were encouraged to continue to be politically active and STA t-shirts were purchased for members.

In an effort to improve communications with members, the STA website was totally redesigned a year or two ago and the STA Facebook page was launched this fall. In addition to our email blasts, these are two more resources for members to use to keep informed of current educational issues.

In lieu of the wine and cheese party this fall, each building was allotted a certain amount of money per member in order to hold a member event. Some schools hosted breakfasts where members wrote letters or downloaded the MAC. Some buildings hosted "labor lunches" where members were informed about recent trends in education and some buildings hosted a light dinner before early evening conferences. I was fortunate to attend most of these events where I was able to hear the concerns of members.

Political action is a requirement during these times. Every year I ask you to join NYSUT's Member Action Center (MAC) and take action whenever required. Many of you wrote letters to your elected officials and watched in disbelief as some of those officials did not stand by you, but instead stood with the Governor and enacted changes to Education Law as part of the NYS budget process which will affect us all. After the budget process, NYSUT members across the state voiced their disapproval and continue to do so. We must keep up the pressure to enact change.

Many of you attended rallies across Long Island and now you have STA t-shirts to wear to these rallies and while attending school events such as fun fairs, sporting events, plays and concerts. If you have not already done so, check out the photos on Facebook of members proudly wearing their new shirts.

As you can see from above, as a union, we made some progress on our goal but we still have work to do. While many of our members are involved, many are not. If we are to be successful as a union, then we must do so as a united group. Remember that the executive committee is not the union but rather your elected leaders. "You" are the union and everyone must be active.

In other news, the NYS Regents unanimously voted to appoint MaryEllen Elia as the new NYS Commissioner of Education. She is a native New Yorker with experience both in and out of the classroom. She spent the last ten years as the superintendent of schools in Hillsborough County, which includes Tampa and is the country's eighth largest district. See page 2 to learn more about her.

NYSUT 43rd Annual Representative Assembly

Our annual meeting of NYSUT officers and delegates was held in early May in Buffalo, NY. STA was represented by five voting delegates: Kim Pritchard, Kat Kelly, Mark Hanik, Allison Noonan and David Steinberg. NYSUT's Annual Rep Assembly convenes in support of the mission of NYSUT, which states "through a representative democratic structure, NYSUT improves the professional, economic and personal lives of our members and their families, strengthens the institutions in which they work, and furthers the cause of social justice through the trade union movement." This year's meeting was energizing, informative and a departure from RAs of the past as it was the first for our new leadership team, lead by Karen Magee (President, NYSUT). NYSUT's annual budget was passed. Annual reports were offered regarding Political and Legislative Action, Constitutional Issues, Member Benefits, Educational Advocacy and Social Justice. There was certainly a lot to talk about concerning our profession. Unfortunately, much of it continues to be a wait-and-see affair until the Regents finish their work on the Governor's requested APPR changes, among other things. Constituency groups represented included: teachers, school-related professionals, retirees, health care professionals, and non-traditional locals (including Special Act Schools). Students groups from around the Buffalo area performed prior to the General Sessions and awards were bestowed to locals in the areas of social justice and community involvement. Syosset, once again, was among a few districts demonstrating a strong commitment to VOTE-COPE, the voice of educators on behalf of children in the political process. As a local, the STA received a Community Service Award for all of our work with charities within the community. An individual award was given to Mark Hanik for his efforts as the STA Community Service Chairperson. Two amendments to the NYSUT Constitution were passed: one involving membership dues and one that defines NYSUT officers as a group of five moving forward.



MaryEllen Elia

The New York State Board of Regents voted to appoint MaryEllen Elia as the next Commissioner of Education and President of the University of the State of New York. Ms. Elia served as superintendent in Hillsborough County, Florida since 2005. Hillsborough County, which includes Tampa, is the nation's eighth largest school district with 206,000 students, 30,000 employees, and a \$2.9 billion budget. A native New Yorker, Ms. Elia began her career in education in 1970 as a social studies teacher in Buffalo's Sweet Home Central School District and taught for 19 years before moving on to administrative positions. Ms. Elia will start her new position on July 6.

NYSUT President Karen E. Magee had this to say about Elia's appointment: "It is vitally important for an education commissioner to respect teachers, to trust those working in public education and to listen — truly listen — to those in the field doing the hard work of teaching the state's students, particularly those who have special needs, are still learning English or live in poverty. This is a challenging time for public education and its educators and there is a lot of hard work ahead. We are encouraged that Commissioner Elia is an educator with decades of experience as both a teacher in New York's public schools and a superintendent in public education, and that she has strong academic credentials from our State University system."
